

**EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The New Mexico Department of Cultural Affairs seeks a Director of the State Monuments Division. The Director should have a demonstrated ability in the administration of a complex organization serving multiple community-based constituencies. At least three years of experience in a senior management position required; a Bachelor's Degree required; and an advanced degree in preservation, history, anthropology, museum administration or related field is preferred. Candidate must have a successful record in fundraising, strategic planning and grant-writing. Extensive experience with the development, management and operation of an organization similar to the State Monuments Division is expected. Knowledge of the Southwest's history, architecture and multi-cultures is desired.

The specific mission of the New Mexico State Monuments Division is to preserve and protect the culturally significant properties designated as state monuments and to provide for their interpretation, use and enjoyment by present and future generations, including educational and outreach programs. The Monuments Division has oversight of the following state-owned historic sites throughout the State of New Mexico:

- Coronado State Monument in Bernalillo, Sandoval County
- Jemez State Monument in Jemez Springs
- Fort Selden State Monument in Radium Springs, Dona Ana County
- Fort Sumner/Bosque Redondo State Monument, DeBaca County
- Lincoln State Monument in Lincoln County
- El Camino Real State Monument, between Socorro and T or C
- The Taylor Reynolds Barela Mesilla State Monument in Mesilla, Dona Ana County
- Fort Stanton State Monument, Lincoln County

This is an exempt position within the State of New Mexico and reports directly to the Museum Board of Regents and the Secretary of the New Mexico Department of Cultural Affairs. It offers a competitive salary with generous benefits and retirement package. The pay range is from \$68,000 to \$75,000.

With its eight museums, eight historic sites known as monuments, and arts, historic preservation, archaeology and library programs, New Mexico Cultural Affairs is among the most ambitious state cultural agencies in the nation.

The position will be based in Santa Fe with required travel to each of the monuments on a frequent basis.
