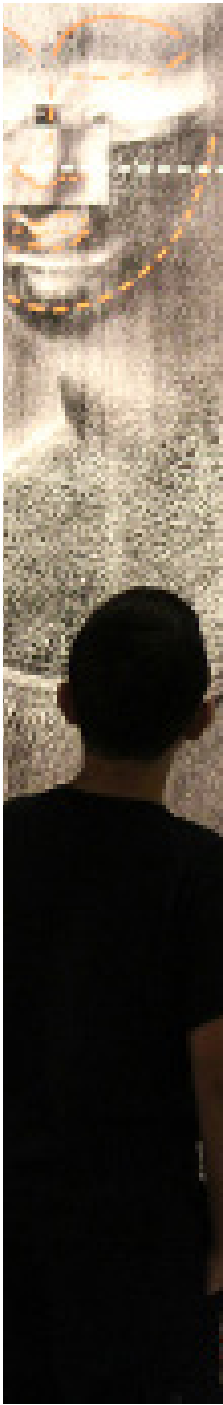
5:30 - 9:00 p.m. | \$5 off admission to *Da Vinci: The Genius*
